
How Oregon hospitals support local economies

associated with hospital activity in Oregon, which includes **69,000** direct hospital employees






Senate District #5 / House Districts #9 and #10



Oregon State **Senate District #5** covers all of Lincoln County and parts of Benton, Coos, Douglas, and Lane counties, and includes Oregon **House Districts 9 and 10**. It contains five hospitals:



Senate District #5



in total economic impacts, which includes \$330 million direct hospital

labor income



5,180 jobs

associated with hospital activity in the district, which includes **2,520** direct hospital employees

House District #9

- \$512 million in total economic impacts, which includes \$216 million direct hospital labor income
- 2,390 estimated total jobs, which includes
 1,620 direct hospital employees

House District #10

- \$536 million in total economic impacts, which includes \$114 million direct hospital labor income
- 2,790 estimated total jobs, which includes
 900 direct hospital employees

Oregon hospitals not only provide life-saving health care services to millions of people, but also they play an important role in the local and state economy.

Hospitals hire local workers with a range of skills and salaries, and buy a wide variety of goods and services, many of which come from Oregon-based businesses. The Hospital Association of Oregon hired ECOnorthwest to measure the economic impact of hospitals. Using the IMPLAN input-output model, ECOnorthwest calculated the direct and indirect effects of hospital spending as it flows through the economy.
